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




Director's Notes On Hidden **HER**stories: *Ada and the Engine*

When I first read this play, I felt a familiar frustration: the tragedy of a brilliant woman's story going untold. Like many, I hadn't known who Ada Byron Lovelace was, yet her life's work speaks so powerfully to our time.

What struck me most is how Lauren Gunderson's writing humanizes these historical figures. They are neither entirely good nor bad; they are complex people caught in a delicate balance between their genius and their flaws. Their true struggle, I believe, is not with each other, but with the patriarchal society that limited their choices.

It is against this backdrop that Ada's vision shines so brightly. Her ability to look beyond the confines of her time to imagine a world where machines could create art is a testament to her incredible spirit. I'm deeply honored to be a part of bringing this important story to the stage with our incredible cast and crew. My hope is that as you watch her journey unfold, you will see a little bit of yourself in her audacious spirit—a testament to the enormous, often unseen, contributions women and the arts have always made to our world.

We are all flawed. There are moments where every single one of us don't get it right, but that is what connects us all as humans. In a time where we are constantly told that being different is wrong, I want all of us to remember that we all have greatness within us. That greatness is what makes us different, and that difference is the whole world.

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


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
