Recent credits include *The Recipe* (Audience Choice Award, Black Art and Film Festival 2025), *Secret Spaces* (The Rooted Door), *Ama Egg Oya* (VOW Festival) and *Jane: Abortion and the Underground*, both with Powerstories Theatre. ANDRESIA MOSELEY (Dee) is a nationally recognized, award-winning actress whose dynamic performances have captivated audiences in productions including Nollywood Dreams, Crowns, The Color Purple, American Son, Doubt: A Parable, and POTUS. She tours nationally with Yankee Bajan, which premiered internationally in Barbados in 2023. Her one-woman portrayal of Anna Deavere Smith's Twilight: Los Angeles 1992 was named "Best Performance of the Year" by Broadway World. Featured in American Theatre Magazine, The Wall Street Journal, and Creative Loafing, Moseley's work—often described as a master class in performance—merges truth, humor, and power with undeniable presence and depth.

ERICA SUTHERLIN+ (Director) is a multi-hyphenate: executive/filmmaker/writer/theatrical director/producer. Ms. Sutherlin is the Artistic Executive Director of the Studio@620. She embraced her passion for the performing arts at an early age while growing up in St. Louis, MO. She holds a Master of Fine Arts in Film and Television Production from the prestigious University of Southern California's School of Cinematic Arts. Erica earned a Bachelor of Arts in Theater Performance from Southern Illinois University/Edwardsville.

Erica's journey in the performing arts space would lead to her selection for Lifetime Network's mentoring program called Broader Focus where up-and-coming creative women are intentionally exposed to the machinations of programming content. More exposure to the dynamics of directing came from the Blackhouse Foundation Sundance Fellows program, followed by being a part of Facebook's SEEN initiative, launched to illuminate underrepresented voices in the entertainment industry. Ms. Sutherlin made her directorial debut with the release of Lifetime Network's hit movie, Kirk Franklin's A Gospel Christmas. A Gospel Christmas marked her second feature following Stratosphere, which she directed and co-wrote. Recently, in the directorial and producer seat, Erica premiered ATONE, a short film in partnership with Safe & Sound Hillsborough.

Erica has directed numerous plays and musicals during her 20+ years in the business. As an equity actor, she performed in the American Stage productions of *Doubt* and *Steel Magnolias*. In 2022, she became the theatre company's Director of Community Engagement. Erica found herself as the director of the award winning musicals *Ragtime: The Musical in the Park*, and *The Color Purple*. In addition to stellar reviews for productions of *Pass Over* by Antoinette Nwandu, and *Dutchman* by Amiri Baraka/LeRoi Jones.

Ms. Sutherlin's keen writing prowess led to narrative features for Village Roadshow and the United Kingdom-based production company, iGeneration Studios. She was a writer for the multiple award-winning film, Voodoo Macbeth, which was produced through Warner Brothers and the University of Southern California (USC). Sharing the spotlight with peer writers, she developed and executive produced the sitcom, Unschooled. Erica would conclude her time at USC in a writer's room, developing, writing, and producing the short-form, limited dramatic series called Sugar Land.

As a poet and essayist, Ms. Sutherlin has contributed content to Building Womanist Coalitions: Writing and Teaching in the Spirit of Love and Hooked on the Art of Love: Bell Hooks and My Calling for Soul-Work, both works by Dr. Gary Lemons, professor of English at University of South Florida.

Erica was awarded for her ongoing impact in the arts when she received a highly competitive 2022 Creative Pinellas Individual Artist Recovery Grant and nominated for First Ladies of African American history society. She was selected as a Fellow with the Advancing Racial Equity on Non-Profit Boards, class of 2022. Erica's broad experience in the performing arts led to an appointment by Mayor Kenneth T. Welch to the City of Saint Petersburg Arts Advisory Committee in 2023. Recently, Ms. Sutherlin was appointed to Committee Chair of the Arts Advisory Committee. Her latest distinction, graduate of the class of 2024 Leadership St. Pete, a competitive leadership program.



ALEXA PÉREZ (Asst. Director) a director and actor local to St. Petersburg, holds a Bachelor of Arts in Performing Arts from the University of Tampa. Alexa is currently both an Artist in Residence and the Associate Artistic Producer at The Studio@620. Past directorial credits include Ada and the Engine (Powerstories), Enemy | Flint (USF), LIFE CORP (The Sarasota Players), Decolonizing Your Mind with Walter Mercado, and After Orlando (American Stage). Director's Notes on Cadillac Crew

It is an honor to share Tori Sampson's *Cadillac Crew* with our Studio@620 and Powerstories Theatre community. This play is not merely a history lesson; it is an act of reclamation, a powerful insistence that we acknowledge the foundational labor of the women whose stories were nearly erased from the official narrative of the Civil Rights Movement.


Cadillac Crew challenges the simplified histories we were taught, pulling us into a Virginia Civil Rights office in 1963 where four women, Rachel, Dee, Abby, and Sarah navigate a complex fight. They are not just fighting the visible enemy of segregation, but also the invisible forces within their own movement that sought to sideline women and suppress the urgency of their specific struggles. The question at the heart of the play is as vital now as it was then: What does true solidarity look like when the fight is multi-layered? We witness the raw, often uncomfortable intersectionality of their lives, where the fight for racial justice collides with the fight for gender equality. These women are the backbone of the movement, yet their voices are often the first to be muted. By the play's end, we are left to confront the profound tragedy of historical erasure and the unsettling thought that their battles continue, simply recast for a modern age.

For The Studio@620, a space dedicated to igniting cultural vibrancy through the exploration of storytelling and society, presenting *Cadillac Crew* is a commitment. It is a commitment to listen to the whole story, to honor the complexity of those who drove the change (literally and figuratively), and to understand that our creative future depends on the voices we choose to lift up today.
